- In 2017, the program expanded its coverage to include Seafarers and Students from the Philippines, India, Poland and Greece.
- In 2019, more than 30,000 Children participated globally in this program.








objectives:



why do Chilren need to learn and be aware of shipping?

Shipping is:

- essential for global trade
- major source of employment
- essential for global economy





essential for global trade

- Shipping industry is one of the oldest industries that continues to play an important role in our modern society.
- in ancient times and even up to this day people have been sending and receiving goods by **sea**.
- about 95% of global trade roughly 11 billion tons by volume are transported by sea annually.
- almost everything we need today is being brought to us by ship.





major source of employment

- more than **2 million** seafarers are employed onboard ship globally according to IMO. About **20 million** interfaced with shipping industry as shore-based staff, port workers, ship builders and marine engineers.
- taking advantage of our geographical condition and location, the Philippines is an archipelago and is surrounded by waters. Shipping has been an important means of transporting goods nationwide, connecting our islands for better development and to facilitate a progressive trading that's vital to our nation's building
- the Philippines is the number one maritime labor producing country.
- a high percentage of international Seafarers are Filipinos.





essential for global economy

- Shipping industry is crucial to the existence of global economy.
- Seafarers are one of those groups of essential workers who work 24/7, keeping local and international trade & commerce moving safely
- Shipping kept our economy afloat especially in the height of the pandemic, thru the remittances the Seafarers sent home to their families

what is Adopt A Ship?

The "Adopt A Ship" program is a FREE program, it is fun and useful <u>teaching resource</u> tool that aims to educate the children about Maritime Awareness, fundamental aspects of geography and gender diversity. This 10 weeks program will be integrated in the Araling Panlipunan (Social Studies) subject of Grades 4-6 students.






how does the basic "adopt a ship" operates?

- the program involves a ship's officer (usually a Captain) assigned to each Teacher of Elementary School Children.
- Each Teacher will communicate with a Seafarer onboard thru email once a week.
- Through this communication the students will get to learn the particulars of the ship, daily activities and life of a seafarer onboard, cargo that ship carry, trading pattern, geography or any information that they will ask or request.






how does the basic "adopt a ship" operates?

- the Students will get to ask 3 questions once a week through the help of their Teacher who will send the questions to the Captain and briefly explain the answers to the Students.
- the students will be given a FREE 2x3 meter world map that they will use to track the movement & location of their "Adopted Ship"








SHIP OFFICER

- Communicates with the school/Teacher once a week thru email.
- Answers the 3 questions of the children once a week thru email.
- Coordinate with the Adopt A Ship
 Coordinator / Company office for concerns
 and progress reporting.
